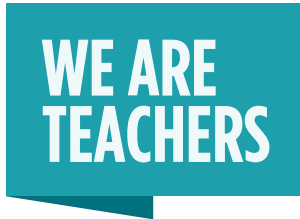


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7 Ways to Spread Sunshine in Your School

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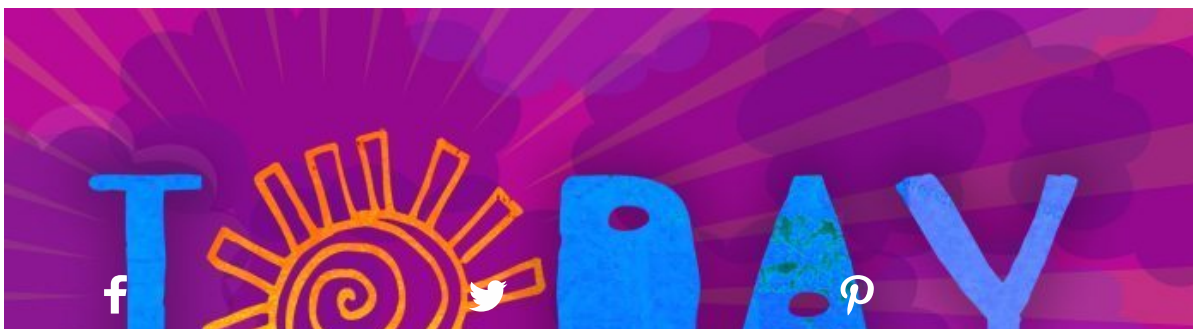


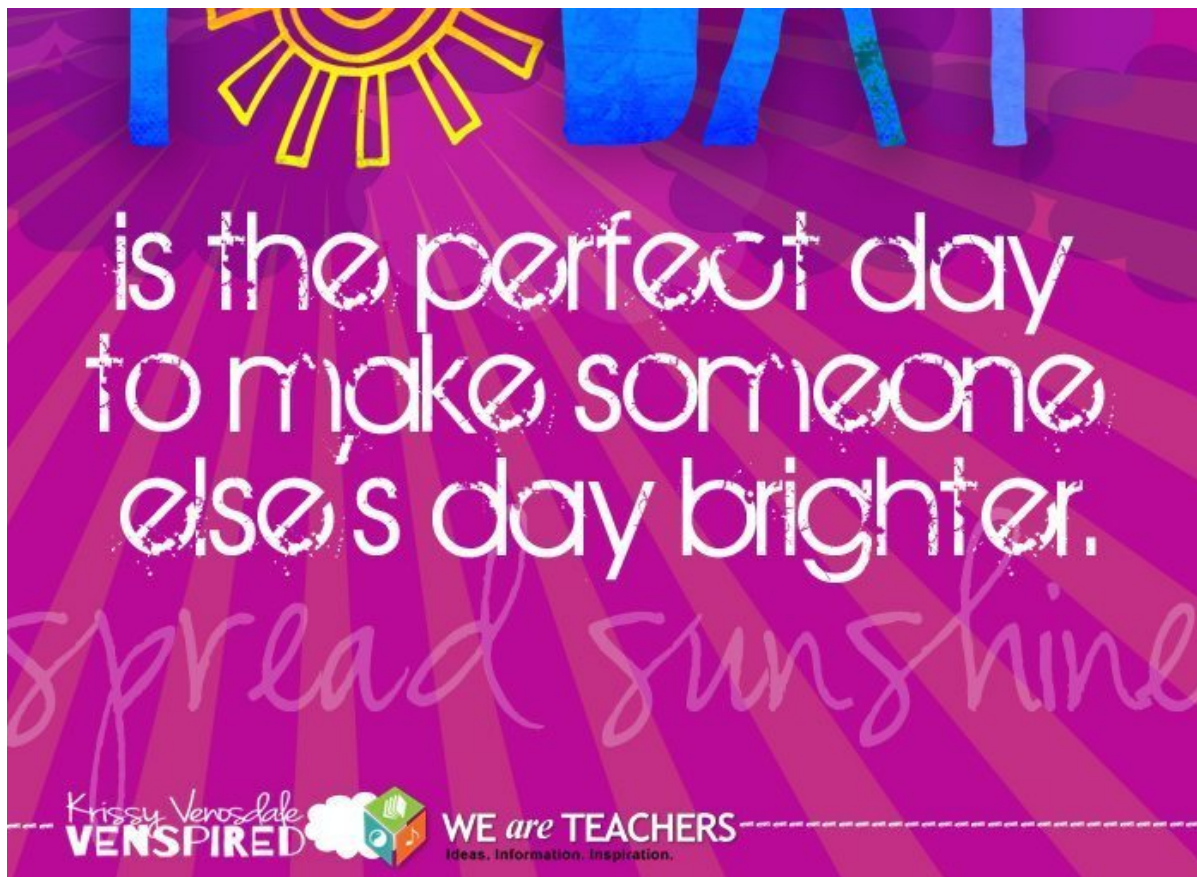

2. Encourage students to record a thank-you message for various staff members around the school. Ask a student volunteer to edit the footage and create a video to share on your school website.

6. Host a recycled-resources swap. You know we all have things at the end of the school year we'd like to give away and that we know others can use. Pick a date and time and send out a message to your colleagues. Gather your best giveaways and meet in the cafeteria after school. Allow everyone to browse and take items that they'd like to use. You know teachers love getting "new" resources. Especially ones that are free!
7. Smile. This one is simple. But the end of the year can be stressful. A little smile goes a long way. Smile at your colleagues. Smile at your administrator. Smile at your students. Smile at your custodian and say thank you.

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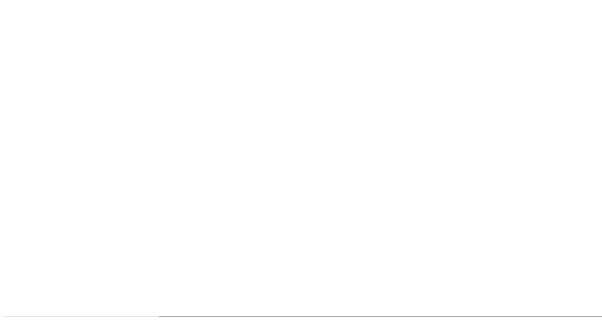
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
